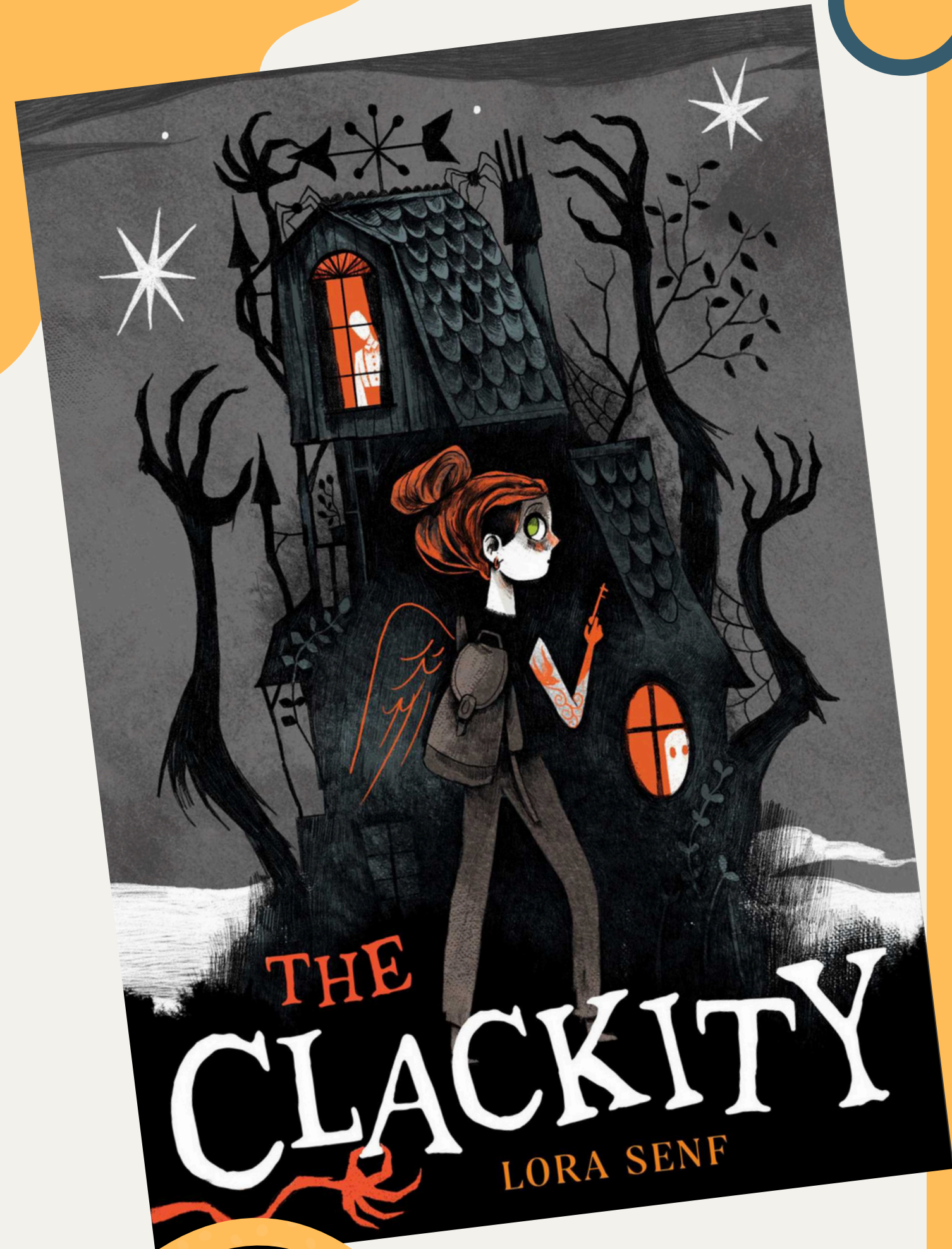

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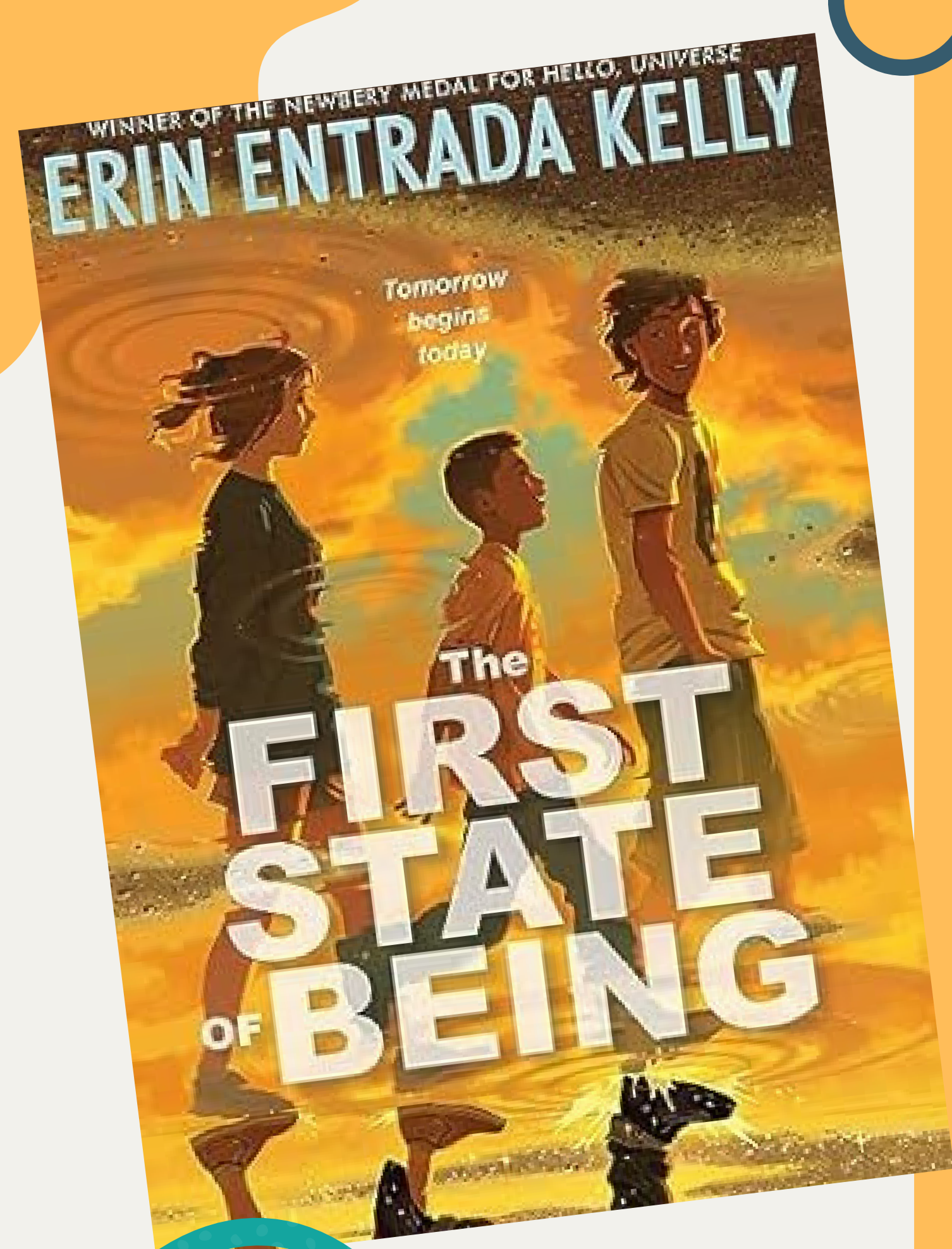




The Clackity by Lora Senf

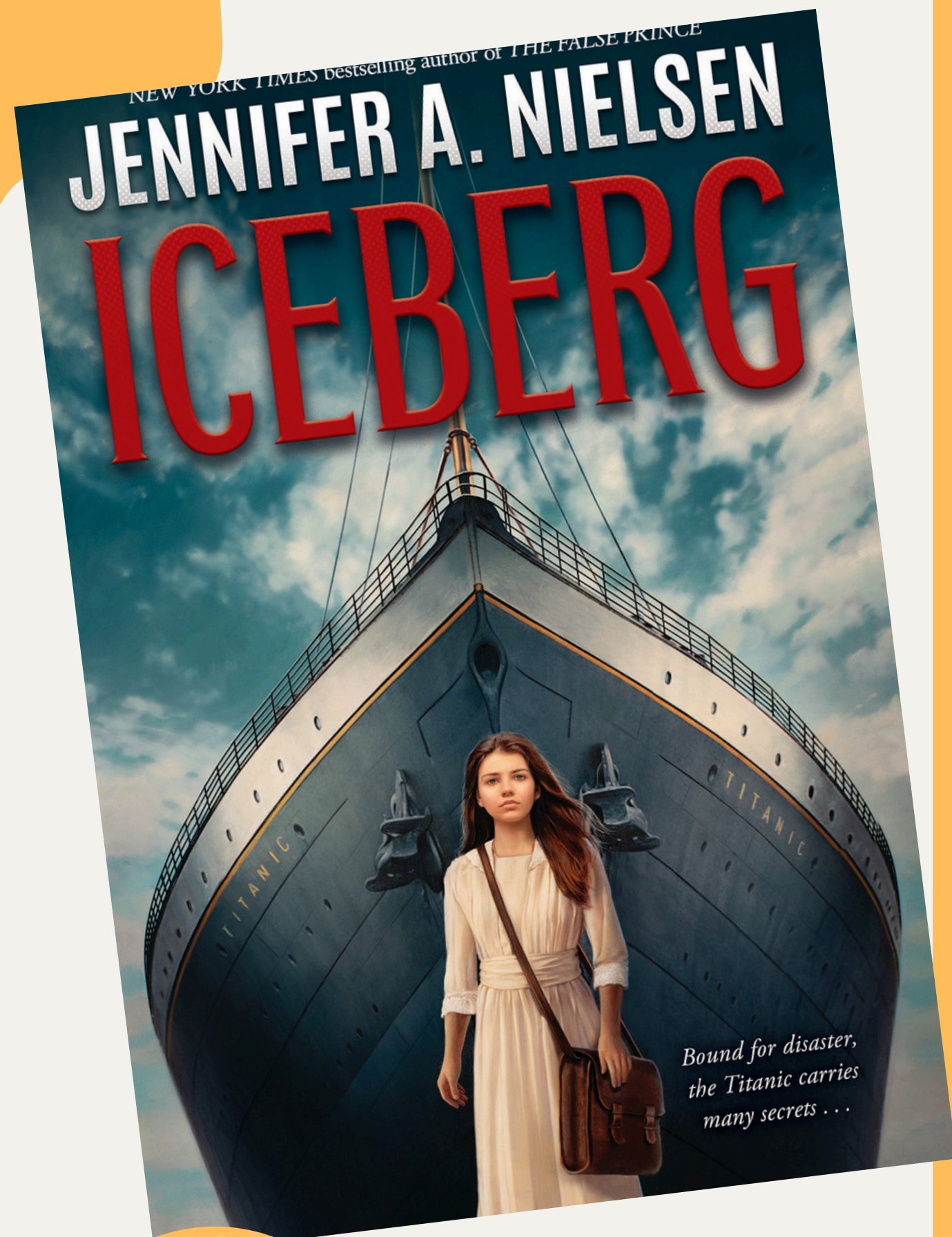




The First State of Being by Erin Entrada Kelly

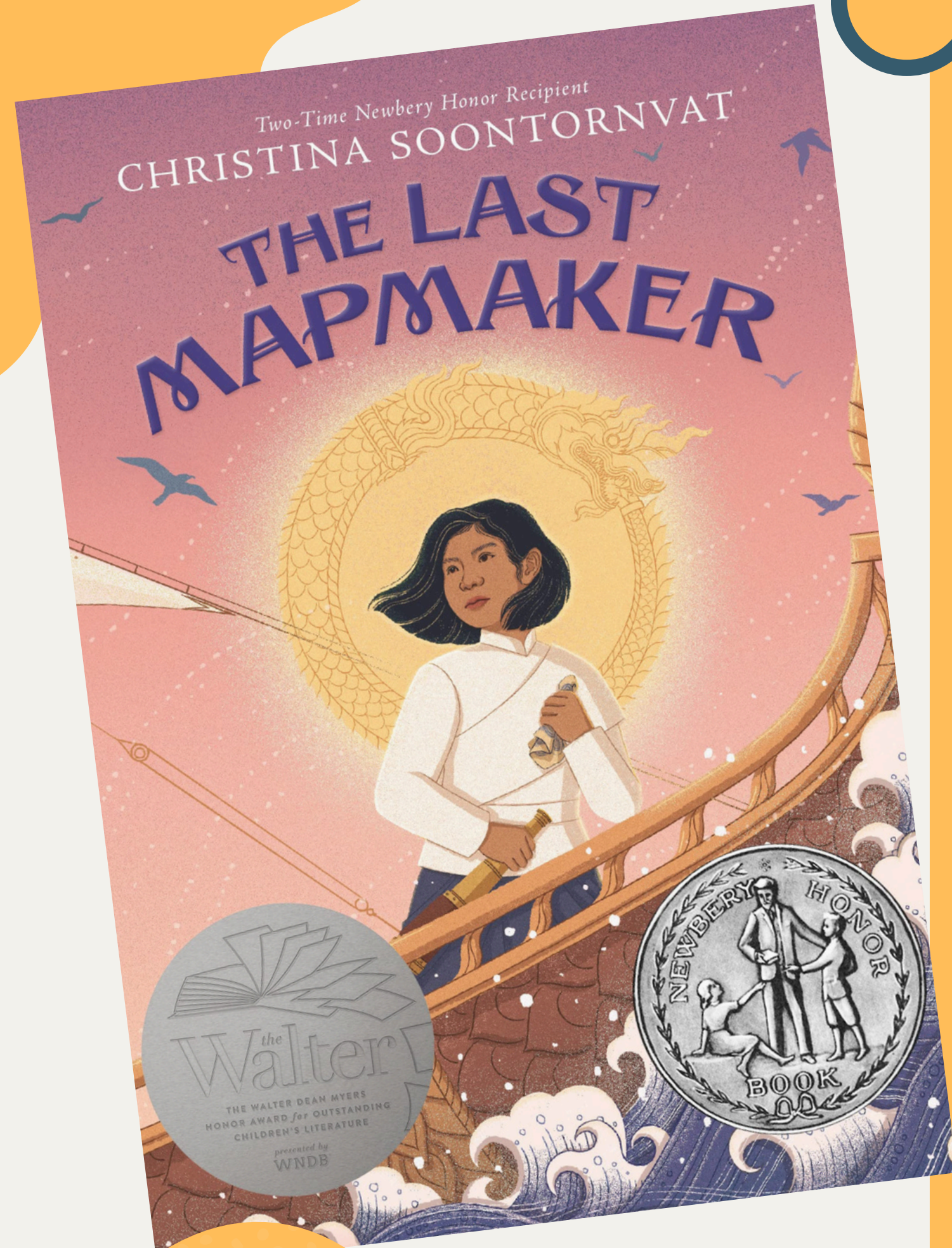


Keeper of the Lost Cities by Shannon Messenger

Everything changes the day she meets Fitz, a mysterious boy who appears out of nowhere and also reads minds. She discovers there's a place she does belong. . .

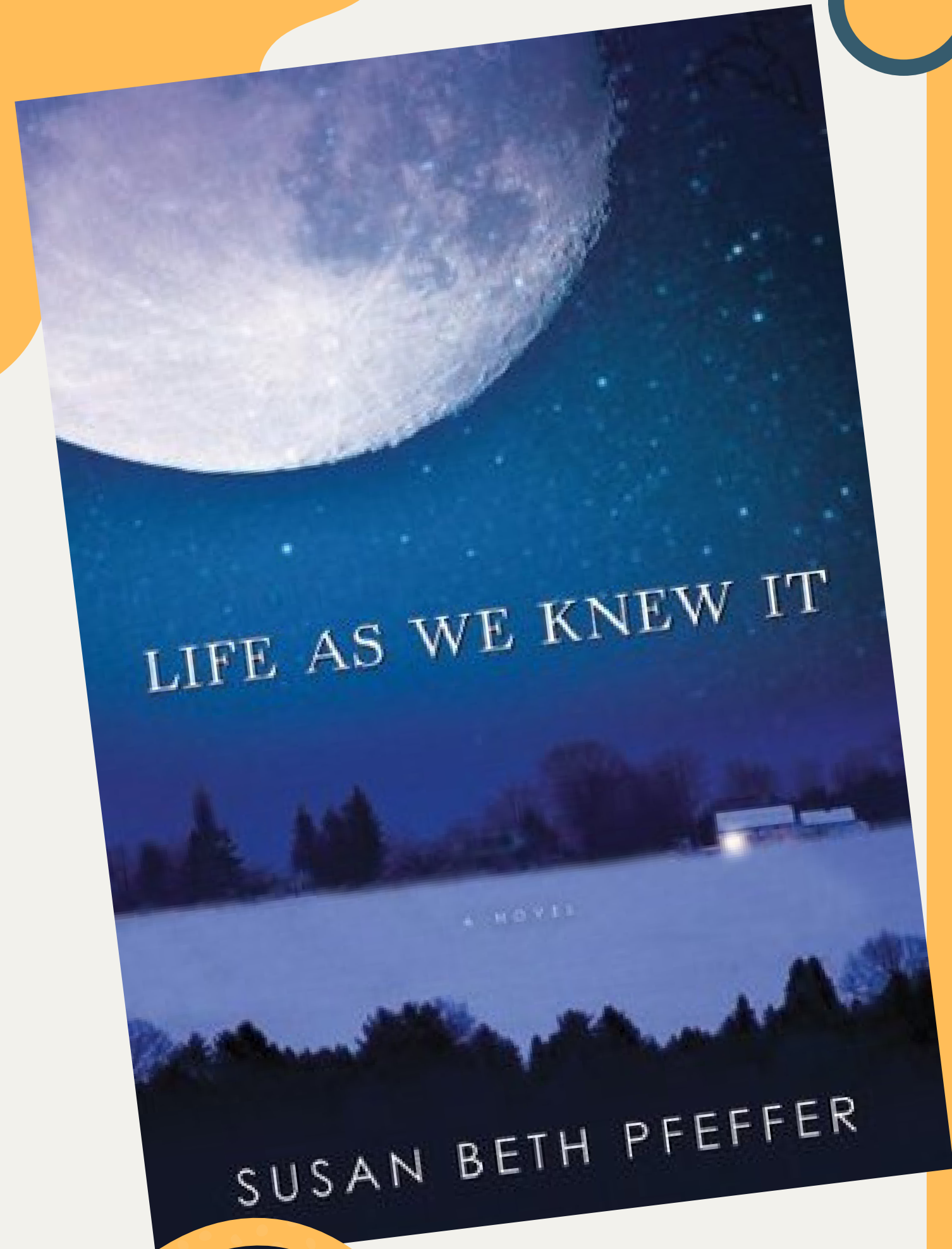




The Last Mapmaker by Christina Soontornvat

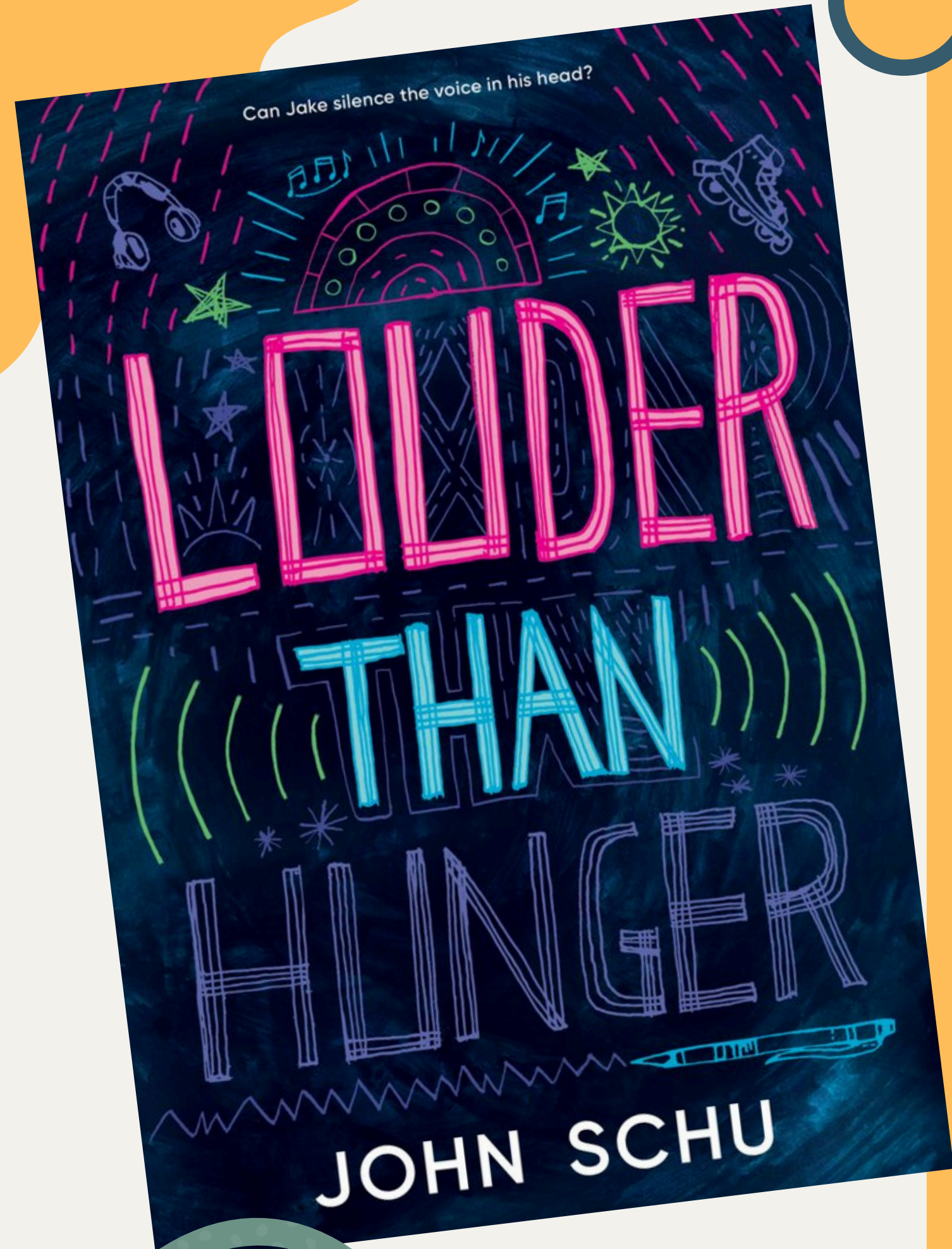




Life As We Knew It by Susan Beth Pfeffer

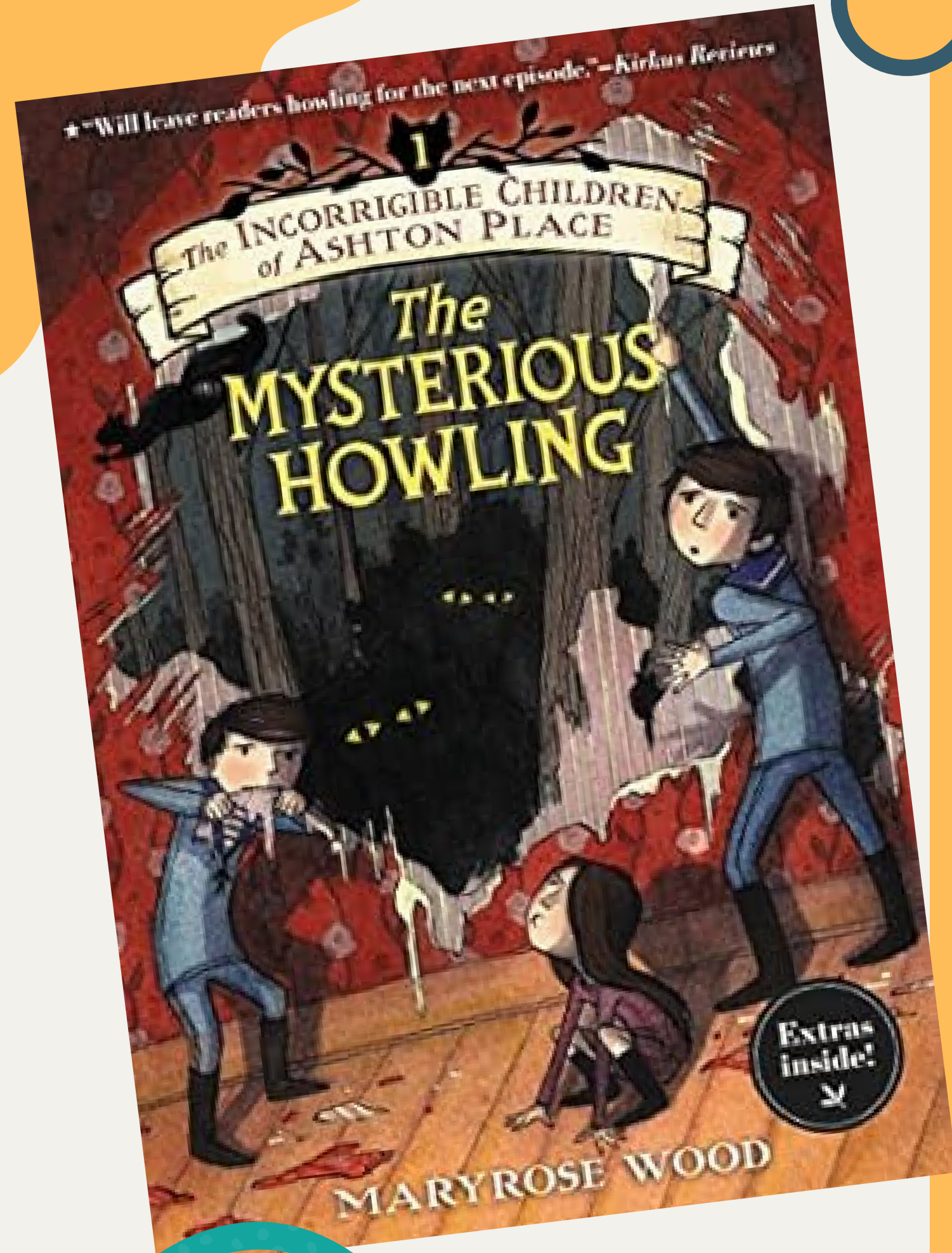




The Curse of the Mummy by Candace Fleming

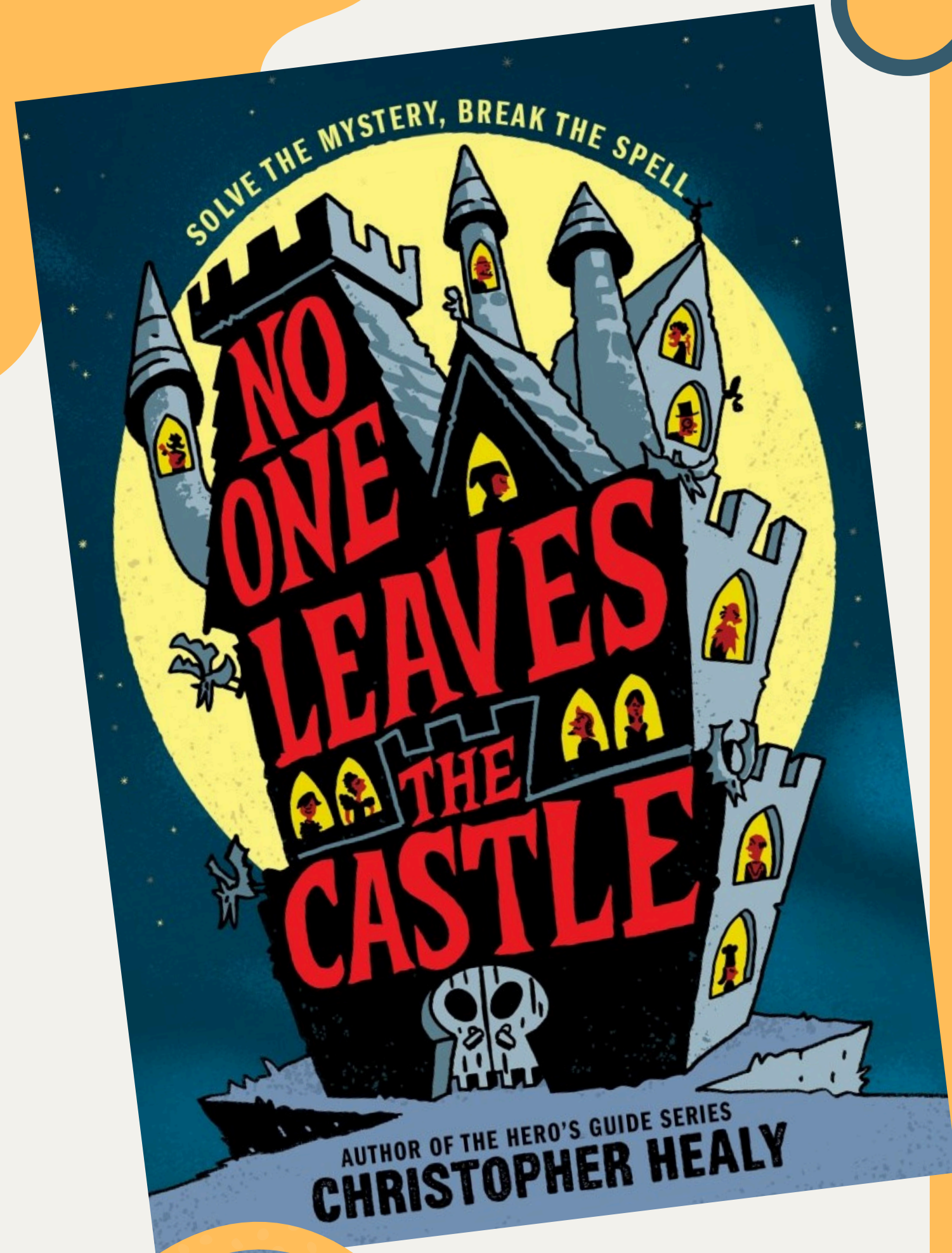




The Mysterious Howling by Maryrose Wood
